## Think Before You Throw: Littering Is A Crime In Nebraska

Unfortunately, we've probably all done it before--tossed a banana peel out the car window, stomped out a cigarette butt on the sidewalk, or carelessly tossed our hamburger wrapper in the ditch.

We know it's bad for the environment and unsightly. But whether we're inconsiderate, uninformed, or just plain lazy, we do it anyway. Over 75% of us have admitted littering in the past 5 years.

In addition to the environmental consequences of littering, there's another reason why you should make an extra effort to find an ashtray, garbage can or recycling bin--**LITTERING IN NEBRASKA IS A CRIME.** Nebraska State Law 28-523 criminalizes littering and defines the perpetrator as "Any person who deposits, throws, discards, or otherwise disposes of any litter on any public or private property or in any waters..."

So spread the word and help stop the epidemic of littering in Nebraska. Whether it's a cigarette butt or an apple core, littering is ugly, irresponsible and *against the law!*

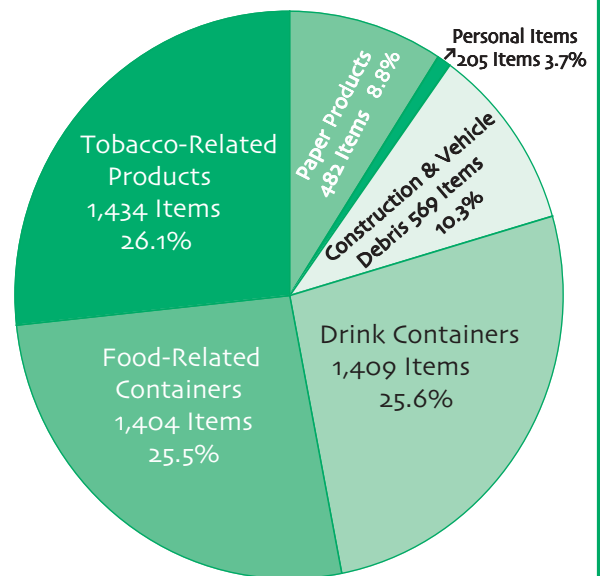

#### WHAT DOES OUR TRASH LOOK LIKE?

IN 2001, THE NEBRASKA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY CONDUCTED A "LITTER SURVEY" OF 154 SITES ACROSS NEBRASKA (2,500 SQ. FT. AT EACH SITE). VARIOUS TYPES OF TRASH WERE DOCUMENTED AND CATEGORIZED. CIGARETTE BUTTS ARE A COMMON FORM OF LITTER, BUT FOOD-RELATED AND DRINK CONTAINERS ACCOUNT FOR OVER HALF THE TRASH LITTERING NEBRASKA'S LANDSCAPE.

# KNB AFFILIATES ROCK!

There are 20 active Keep America Beautiful local affiliates across the state. Dedicated staff and volunteers at each affiliate are working hard on innovative projects to educate children and adults about taking responsibility for their communities, litter reduction, and beautification and cleanup efforts. In the next several newsletters, we will be sharing recent success stories from each affiliate from that have significantly impacted their community.



## Keep North Platte/Lincoln County Beautiful

Middle School students from Madison and Adams schools in North Platte and Maxwell Elementary from another Lincoln County community asked Keep North Platte Beautiful to help them organize an activity for "Kick Butts" Day. Thirty-three students were organized, and each team given designated areas to collect as many cigarette butts as possible in 45 minutes.

The activity was a real "eye-opener" for the young people involved in the cleanup effort. As a result, awareness information about cigarette butt litter was placed at each of the cleanup sites and additional containers were added for more accessible disposal of smoking materials.

## Keep Chadron Beautiful

To facilitate recycling in Chadron, Keep Chadron Beautiful collects white office paper from 55 local businesses. Last year, they collected 41,000 pounds of paper for recycling.

In an effort to promote recycling in the local schools, KCB challenged students at three local schools to meet or exceed the paper tonnage collected from businesses. Each class began the project by decorating a box for collecting recycled paper. KCB staff now visits the schools weekly to weigh and collect the paper. One school consistently collects over 200 pounds of paper each week!

## Keep Keith County Beautiful

In July of 2002, the City of Ogallala and the surrounding area was flooded. When the water receded, trash was left littering the I-80 Interchange near the city. Keep Keith County Beautiful mobilized a cleanup effort and collected one ton of trash in the area.

In addition, staff and volunteers cleaned 15 miles of beach around Lake McConaughy. This cleanup was organized as part of the International Coastal Cleanup.



## Keep Omaha Beautiful

On a recent Saturday, the annual **Youth Fall Cleanup** organized by Keep Omaha Beautiful had 1,300 young people and their leaders cleaning up the city. The kids received a commendation from the mayor for their efforts, and a local Burger King donated coupons for free food.

The **Helping Hands Project** is designed to assist the elderly with fall leaf raking. So far this season, 106 elderly Omaha citizens have been helped through this innovative program.

KOB received a grant this year for their **Sierra/Francis House Cleanup Project**. The project pays a stipend to the homeless in return for cleaning up the area around the new Omaha convention and arena center.

# Nebraska Keep America Beautiful Affiliates

Keep Nebraska Beautiful presented awards to the Nebraska Keep America Beautiful (KAB) affiliates to honor and recognize their past year's achievements on October 24 in North Platte. On hand to present the awards was KAB Director of Education and Training, Sue Smith, and KNB Board President, Mike Schrad.

**Keep Alliance Beautiful** was reenergized during the past year with the hiring of a new Executive Director. They involved 550 volunteers who donated \$35,000 worth of service to improving their community. Volunteers included students creating recycled art to elderly doing mailings for KAB. One major focus has been maintaining the school white paper recycling effort despite the withdrawal of the only private recycling business from Alliance. Director Deb Dopheide accepted a Gold Award.



**Keep Beatrice Beautiful** completed many successful projects including: encouraging 10,000 attendees at the Homestead Days Parade and 35,000 at their County Fair to keep both events litter-free via 30 litter boxes placed on all street corners and young Litternauts keeping litter picked up. Additionally, 100 miles of roadsides were cleaned by 776 youth, 3 illegal dumpsites were cleared and they sponsored a city-wide cleanup. The cleanups resulted in 143,870 lbs of trash being removed --including 250 old tires from the Big Blue River. 200 youth participated in their Trash Trek for Litter cleaning 1000 blocks! In addition to all the cleanups, they also sponsored several spruce up/beautification projects and educated youth and adults alike. Director Linda Grell accepted a Gold Award.



**Keep Fremont Beautiful's** primary strategy for litter prevention is to provide a continuous education program reaching all age groups and segments of the population. They distribute litterbags, butt buckets & pocket ashtrays at community events and in high traffic areas; sponsor an adopt-a-spot flower garden program in high traffic area parks and the Library; partner

with the City Parks Dept. in offering free trees to all homeowners; sponsor an awards program; contribute twice-monthly columns in the Fremont Tribune; and organize a Kids' Eco Fair. Keep Fremont Beautiful received a Gold Award.

**Keep Keith County Beautiful** reorganized from a previous inactive affiliate and has jumped in with both feet! Classroom presentations were made to all 3rd & 4th graders; booths were setup at several show and fairs; monthly articles were written in the Keith County News and Chamber Newsletters; trees were planted; and the GAC helped 83 flooded homes and businesses collect their ruins via their De'Litter Buggy trailer which serves as a recycling center on wheels. They also tackled hosting a Haz-Mat Day and began a membership program. Director Lexi Bauer accepted a Gold Award.



**Keep Kimball Beautiful's** activities include education in the schools and in adult organizations, Trees for Trash, putting Nebraska Litter Laws in car litter bags, planting and maintain flower gardens at the entrances to the city, downtown cleanups and flower barrels, and keeping 40 tons of waste out of the waste stream by manning the Recycling Depot and educating the public on the value of recycling and Buying Recycled. Coordinator Kay Snyder accepted a Silver Award.



**Keep Lexington Beautiful** has asked their residents to "Tie the Knot." Through a public ad campaign in newspapers, radio, TV & billboards, they have encouraged people to tie plastic store bags in a knot before disposing in the trash (if they can't recycle it) to prevent bags from blowing out of containers. A new billboard in both English and Spanish also reminds their residents that "Litter, It's Beneath You". All 3rd graders are deputized as "Litter Deputies" for their school and neighborhoods. A new mascot "Garby" is an

animated trash can that is a frequent visitor at public events. 'Redneck' radio ads have reminded citizens of ordinance laws and proper trash disposal, and a radio station offered the public an opportunity to play Environmental Jeopardy. KLB provides 2 recycling trailers for schools or groups to use, and they held a computer recycling event which collected 1,250 lbs of computers. Director Cyndi Smith accepted a Gold Award.

## Keep Lincoln & Lancaster County Beautiful's



efforts have included continuation of their Illegal Dumping Billboard campaign; involving over 100 youth in the Star City Holiday Parade Trash Can Band; working with 3 of the 6

high schools to "Keep Their Campus Clean;" engaging businesses to H.E.L.P. (Have Employees do Litter Pickup); organizing neighborhood cleanups; Storm Water Awareness Program stencilling; distributing Driver Education Litter Law Booklets and car litter bags to all driver education programs in the county; and co-sponsoring the Earth Wellness Festival. Director Harry Heafer accepted their Gold Award.

## Keep North Platte/Lincoln County Beautiful

has kept busy with numerous projects and activities during the past year including: distribution of door-to-door litter/waste info, recycling survey, adopt-a-spot, Pride Patrol, Volunteer Recognition, various cleanups, 2 Household Hazardous Waste collections, Gazebo Renew, Hi-Plains Water Day, Fall Fun Fest, Every Litter Bit Hurts School Program, Learn & Service-Pay It Forward, Yuletide Yards, KIDS Klub, Kick Butts, Borrow A Bike, Neighbor Helping Neighbor, and a volunteer picnic cooked by the KNPLCB Board. Director Sara Morris accepted a Gold Award.



## Keep Schuyler Beautiful

promotes litter prevention through a variety of different activities including classroom activities with 3rd, 5th & 6th graders, distribution



of car litter bags for Motorist Awareness Day, students decorated grocery sacks for Earth Day, Spring Fling and school participation in KNB's Litter-Free School Program. Beautification and Community Improvement activities included a Decorate a Garbage Drum contest, Adopt-a-Spot, and the planting of 200 red, white & blue petunias in a flag-shaped Liberty Garden. Keep Schuyler Beautiful operates a large community recycling facility as well as a recycling trailer. Director Joan Mejstrik was presented a Gold Award.



**Keep Scottsbluff-Gering Beautiful** has a variety of litter prevention and waste reduction educational programs as well as beautification and community improvement activities. Among them are: Presentations

to schools, a litter poster contest, adopt-A-Spot mini-grants, booth display at Spring Fling, GAC events & Nebraska Motorists Litter Awareness Day, Liberty Garden at their zoo, Paint, Drop & Swap and Used Oil Collection Day, storm drain decal project, Golden Spade and Honor-A-Business Awards, recycling in businesses and schools, Christmas Tree Recycling, an Electronic Collection Event and tremendous media support. Director Kathy Kropuenske received a Silver Award.

**Keep Sidney Beautiful** is the newest KAB affiliate in Nebraska having been certified last November.

However, being new was not a reason for them to take things slow! Some of their initial activities included providing classroom presentations, assisting with the Western Nebraska Children's Groundwater Festival, staffing a booth at the Kwest radio expo, school participation in KNB's Litter-Free School Zone program, initiation of the first annual "Great Trash Race of Sidney", downtown cleanups, and an Easter Litter Hunt. Director Rick Spearow is also the City Recycling Coordinator and oversees the community recycling program. In their first 5 months of affiliation, Keep Sidney Beautiful utilized 615 volunteers who donated 1100 hours. Director Rick Spearow was presented a Gold Award.



# The Nebraska Materials Exchange Program

The Nebraska Materials Exchange, a Keep Nebraska Beautiful program, has a simple goal--to divert usable or recyclable material from landfills.

The Materials Exchange is basically an information database. Program participants who are seeking or generating materials are "connected" by Exchange Facilitators in an attempt to match materials for reuse or recycling, keeping it out of Nebraska landfills.

The program is free, and participants include Nebraska businesses, schools, and nonprofit organizations. Since the Exchange began in 1994, over 19,500 tons of material have been diverted from the landfills. The Exchange Program has recently enjoyed unprecedented growth with a 200% increase in program participants just in the past few years.

Participants in the Exchange Program can benefit in a number of different ways. By locating recycling or reuse options, companies can save disposal and storage fees. Nonprofit organizations and schools often use the Exchange to find computers, office supplies, and equipment at reduced or no cost.

Here are a few success stories from the past several months:

❖ *Two Nebraska schools received free lab cabinets when a local company cleared out a warehouse.*

❖ *A Lincoln company avoided a hazardous materials disposal fee by giving unused furniture stripper to a local wood shop.*

❖ *10 tons of glass-filled nylon was picked up by a recycler instead of going to a Nebraska landfill.*

❖ *A phone system from a doctor's office in Fremont is now being used by a Panhandle humane society.*

# Litter-Free School Zones Program Enjoying Success!

The Litter-Free School Zones program has added thirty new schools since the start of the school year. This program works with schools to ensure their grounds are kept litter-free through weekly cleanups and promoting school events as litter-free.

The new participants have already had some great successes. Since joining the program last quarter, they added 36 cleanups to the total 112, picked up 92 of the 381 bags of litter, and contributed 615 volunteers to the total of 2,624. They also added 6 litter-free events to the total of 11 events for the quarter. All of this was accomplished in the first four to six weeks of school. Below is a list of the new participants:
