Keep Nebraska Beautiful... 40 Years Young

This year, Keep Nebraska Beautiful is celebrating its 40th anniversary. To honor the milestone, special events are planned throughout the year to highlight our successes and educate Nebraska citizens about our waste reduction, recycling, and litter programs. Help us celebrate our history and join us to Keep Nebraska Beautiful for many future years to come!

- 1964 Governor Frank Morrison signed an Executive Order creating the Governor's Council to Keep Nebraska Beautiful.
- 1970 Celebrated the first Earth Day in Omaha with Keep America Beautiful (KAB) President.
- 1976 KNB bylaws were amended and our trademark name registered as Governor's Council to Keep Nebraska Beautiful.
- 1978 North Platte Clean City Committee certified as the first Nebraska KAB affiliate.
- 1979 Nebraska Litter Reduction & Recycling Act was passed by the Legislature.
- 1980 Certified as the third state affiliate of Keep America Beautiful.
- 1981 Welcomed new KAB affiliates in Scottsbluff/Gering, Omaha, Grand Island, Alliance and Ogallala.
- 1982 Affiliates in Norfolk, Beatrice, Kimball, Creighton, and Lincoln/Lancaster Co. were certified.
- 1983 KAB affiliates in Fremont and Plattsmouth were certified.
- 1984 KAB affiliates in Chadron and Columbus were certified.
- 1990 Founder Deanie Anderson, "Mrs. A", who served the organization for 26 years, died.
- 1991 Rushville became a KAB certified affiliate.
- 1994 The Materials Exchange Program was introduced to divert usable or recyclable material from Nebraska landfills. Keep Broken Bow Beautiful was certified.
- 1995 "Grow Big Red" was introduced and Keep Lexington Beautiful was certified.
- 1996 Keep Northeast Nebraska Beautiful certified as state's first KAB Regional Affiliate.
- 1999 The Great American Cleanup™ replaced the Bag-a-thon as KAB's national signature event for cleanup and beautification efforts. KNB coordinates event in Nebraska.
- 1999 Keep Schuyler Beautiful was certified as a KAB affiliate. KNB introduced Litter Free School Zones Program. By 2003, over 100 schools were participating.
- 2000 The Nebraska Used Oil Collection Program was introduced with 12 "pilot" site locations in southeast Nebraska. By 2003, the program had grown to include 56 collection site locations and collected over 250,000 gallons of used oil for recycling.
- 2002 KNB formed a Leadership/Management Team to begin the planning stages for implementation of a statewide Household Hazardous Waste Collection Program.
- 2002 KNB promotes KAB's Liberty Gardens, to honor those who lost their lives on 9/11.
- 2004 KNB kicks off its 40th year anniversary celebration!

Executive Director's Comments

Keep Nebraska Beautiful Environmental Awards

If your group or community has shown a commitment to improving the environment, why not enter your efforts in the KNB Awards Program? Entrants can enter one category in addition to the Deanie Anderson Community Award and the Great American Cleanup™ Award. In this way, we hope to honor as many different entrants as possible. This year's awards will be based on environmental projects accomplished from July 1, 2002 to July 1, 2004.

Award Categories:

❖ Deanie Anderson Community Award

A plaque and \$200 cash award to be given to a community for its overall environmental program in honor of the late Deanie Anderson who served as President of Keep Nebraska Beautiful for 26 years. There are 3 population categories: Less than 2,500; 2,501-10,000; 10,000+

❖ Youth Group/School Award

The award includes a plaque and \$50 cash award and will be presented to a youth group or school to recognize their efforts in promoting a cleaner and more beautiful environment through cleanups, beautification, recycling, etc. The award has two categories: Elementary (K-6th grades) and Secondary (7-12 grades)

❖ Civic/Non-Profit Organization

A plaque and a \$50 cash award will be given for efforts in environmental education programs, litter control, beautification, recycling, etc.

❖ Business/Industry Award

A plaque will be presented to a business who has demonstrated substantial efforts to enhance the environment through reducing, reusing, recycling and beautification within the business/industry and their community.

❖ Great American Cleanup™ Award

A plaque and a \$50 cash award will be presented to a community, neighborhood, school, or group for outstanding cleanup, beautification or recycling efforts during the Great American Cleanup™

❖ "Grow Big Red" Award

A plaque and \$50 cash award will be given to an individual or group who has enhanced the environment through the planting of red flowers.

❖ KAB Affiliate

Local KAB affiliates will be presented gold, silver or bronze awards.

All award entries **must be received by September 1, 2004** to be considered. The Awards Luncheon will be held on Friday, October 22, 2004 at the Steinhart Lodge, just east of the Lied Conference Center in Nebraska City.

KNB AFFILIATES CONTINUE SUCCESS

Keep Nebraska Beautiful has 20 KAB affiliates across the state. Dedicated staff and volunteers at each affiliate are working hard to provide successful projects to educate children and adults about taking responsibility for their communities' litter reduction, beautification and cleanup efforts. These success stories highlight the dedication and innovation of our affiliates and their volunteers.

Keep Beatrice Beautiful

Throughout 2003, Beatrice clubs, organizations, churches, and school groups worked to cleanup city and county right-of-ways and participated in other educational, recycling, and litter cleanup efforts. Fifty-eight groups cleaned 100 miles of right-of-way and participated in a number of other activities. A total of 561 bags of trash weighing 6.78 tons was collected.

The Gage County Tire Amnesty was a huge success for the city and county. Funded by a grant from the Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality, the Gage County Extension office and Keep Beatrice Beautiful partnered to manage the event in July 2003. During the three-day event, 690 Gage County residents brought in 35,000 tires weighing 358 tons. Scrap tires have become an increasingly important environmental concern because standing water accumulated in the tires can be a breeding ground for mosquitoes and West Nile Virus. Not only did this cleanup improve the landscape in the county, it also minimized this potential health threat. Great work!



Keep Fremont Beautiful



For the past twenty years, Keep Fremont Beautiful (KFB) and the City of Fremont have partnered to conduct an annual Dial-A-Truck Program. The program is designed to assist citizens with disposal of large discards such as appliances, furniture, and carpeting that cannot be picked up on a regular garbage route.

Citizens call KFB to make a reservation for a city truck to come to their home and pick up the large items. The City Street Department provides the workers and the trucks, and KFB coordinates the pickup reservations and pays the landfill disposal fees. In 2003, a total of 32 appliances were picked up and taken to an appliance recycler who reclaimed any freon and dismantled the appliances so the metal could be recycled. In all, 630 pounds of metal was recycled and 1,080 pounds actually went to the landfill. Congratulations to KFB for continuing to provide this vital service to the community.

Keep Schuyler Beautiful



In order to encourage recycling, Keep Schuyler Beautiful suggested the high school make all sporting events with concession stands "Litter Free Events" by collecting and recycling plastic drink bottles. The administration agreed and a program was put in place. Participants who return a plastic bottle to the concession for recycling receive a free piece of "gummy" candy. At the end of the game, sports fans are encouraged to fill a trash bag with litter and return it for a reward. The program educates students and their parents about the importance of recycling and litter reduction. Congratulations to Keep Schuyler Beautiful for this successful and innovative program.

2004 GREAT AMERICAN CLEANUP™



Most of us will embark on spring cleaning soon. Closets will be organized, yards raked, and basements shoveled out. But just like our houses and yards, our communities need sprucing up every spring, too.

For eighteen years, Keep America Beautiful has sponsored and organized the Bag-a-Thon and now the Great American Cleanup™ (GAC), a nationwide effort to encourage community cleanup and beautification efforts. Last year over 2 million volunteers organized and participated in GAC events in all 50 states. It's like spring cleaning for the entire country!

The goal of the Great American Cleanup™ is to inspire residents, businesses, organizations, and politicians at the state and local level to improve and beautify their community environment. The GAC encourages volunteerism, allows residents to take personal responsibility for their community, and promotes litter prevention, recycling, and beautification. The entire community can benefit through the efforts of Great American Cleanup™ volunteers by fostering a sense of community pride and ownership.

In 2003, Nebraskans in 140 communities participated in 500 GAC events. Some of the events included planting Liberty Gardens, collecting roadside trash, cleaning neighborhood parks, and collecting recyclables. Nearly 12,000 volunteers planted trees, painted over graffiti, and collected clothing for charity.

To celebrate the 40th anniversary of Keep Nebraska Beautiful, we want to make 2004 the most successful year ever for the Great American Cleanup™ in Nebraska. But to do that, we need your help! We have contacted communities all across Nebraska invited them to participation in a variety of GAC events. We need civic organizations, community leaders, and churches to organize events, and we need volunteers to make every event a huge success.

Please help us clean up and beautify local communities this spring and make the 2004 Great American Cleanup™ the most successful in Nebraska history! - ❖ **Grow Big Red** - Show your Husker pride by planting a garden using any combination of red or red and white flowers. Plant the garden in a park, school, or other common area.
- ❖ **Recycling** - Conduct a recycling drive in your community. You can even collect aluminum cans for money, then donate the proceeds to a local charity. Now that's a win/win project!
- ❖ **Beautification Projects** - Plant gardens, shrubs, and trees in your community. Paint park benches, plant container gardens on main street, build new signage for the local library, etc.

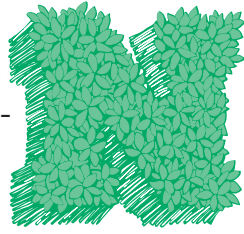

To celebrate the Cornhusker's National Championship seasons, Keep Nebraska Beautiful introduced the "Grow Big Red" project in 1995. Grow Big Red encourages communities and individuals to



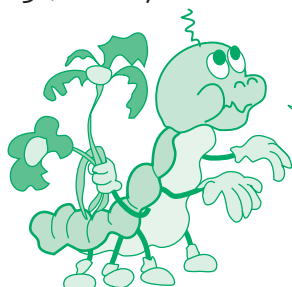
plant flower gardens using only red or red and white flowers. In honor of KNB's 40th anniversary and to show our Husker pride, we want to encourage Nebraskans to plant the state red!

Community organizations can contact their local city parks and recreation departments to identify locations where public gardens can be planted. It might be in areas like schools, parks, zoos, or other public property.

Participation in Grow Big Red is easy. Just go to our website at www.knb.org and fill out the participation form. If you need red flower seeds for your gardens, just let us know. We have free flower seeds available on a first come, first serve basis.

Here are some ideas for getting your community involved in Grow Big Red this spring:

- ❖ Recruit youth organizations such as 4-H clubs, Scouts, and church groups to plant flowers in your community. The groups could even "adopt" a nursing home, school, or local park for a planting event.
- ❖ Plant a Grow Big Red garden in your yard and encourage your neighbors to do the same.
- ❖ Organize a garden competition in your community with Grow Big Red as a theme. Publicize the competition, register participants, then plan a Husker garden tour mid-summer for all participating gardens.
- ❖ Plant containers of red flowers along main street, in front of the local library, other city buildings, or at your schools.



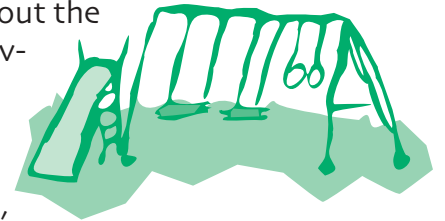

40 WAYS TO KEEP NEBRASKA BEAUTIFUL

1. Volunteer to organize a **Great American Cleanup™** event.
2. Carry a litter bag in your car or boat.
3. Before dumping your computer or other electronic equipment into the garbage, call KNB or e-mail <info@knb.org> to find out if there is an electronics recycler in your area.
4. Secure trash container lids to prevent blowing litter.
5. Volunteer to help organize a recycling program where you work or at school.
6. Buy a reusable, cloth bag to use when shopping for groceries.
7. If possible, repair broken items rather than tossing them in the landfill and buying a replacement.
8. Compost yard waste, grass clippings and non-meat food waste.
9. Turn off the lights, television, stereo, etc., when they are not in use.
10. Store leftovers in reusable containers rather than using plastic wrap or aluminum foil.
11. Purchase a battery charger and rechargeable batteries.
12. Organize volunteers to plant a **"Grow Big Red"** Garden in your community.
13. Instead of purchasing a gift, give the gift of time: wash the dishes for a week, clean the house for a period of time, or volunteer for a local charity.
14. Seek environmentally-friendly ways to handle a garden or household pest problem. Check with your local County Extension Office for ideas.
15. Instead of using a clothes dryer, put a clothesline in the backyard to use in nice weather.
16. Instead of using hazardous chemicals to clean your house, use more environmentally-friendly products like baking soda, rubbing alcohol and vinegar. Check out the household hazardous waste educational information on our website www.knb.org for ideas on making your own products.
17. If your local school isn't a member of KNB's **Litter-Free School Zones Program**, encourage them to join today!
18. Buy only what you need and will use (paint, fertilizer, groceries, etc.)
19. Use cloth napkins, towels, and sponges instead of disposable paper products.
20. Recycle used oil. Visit www.knb.org for the **Nebraska Used Oil Collection Program** sites near you.
21. Use a washable mug instead of a styrofoam or paper cup.
22. Recycle aluminum cans, and all other items your local recycling center accepts.
23. Enter your efforts in the **Keep Nebraska Beautiful Environmental Awards Program**.
24. Purchase energy-saving appliances whenever possible.
25. Water your lawn early in the morning. This reduces evaporation and saves water!
26. Insulate your water heater to save energy.
27. Don't litter! Remember litter includes cigarette butts, gum, and unwanted foodstuffs.
28. Purchase recycled products and products packaged using recycled materials.
29. Print and photocopy on both sides of the paper.
30. Instead of purchasing new products, consider refurbishing furniture and electronic equipment. The Materials Exchange is an excellent resource for finding used equipment and furniture. Just visit the Materials Exchange section of our web site at www.knb.org.
31. Adopt and beautify a local spot in your community to keep it litter-free and looking good!
32. Dispose of household products safely. Contact your KAB affiliate, RC&D or the health department in your area for times and locations of household hazardous waste collections.
33. Plant drought-tolerant grasses, ground covers, shrubs and trees.
34. Instead of flying or driving off to some remote location, consider vacationing within the state.
35. Wash and dry only full loads of laundry whenever possible.
36. Walk or ride a bicycle whenever possible.
37. Buy locally grown food items. Support your local farmers' market!
38. Donate clean, usable items to charity.
39. Sweep your driveway and sidewalk. Don't use the hose or sweep into the street.
40. Contact your **local Keep America Beautiful Affiliate** and ask how you can volunteer for a cleanup or beautification event in your community.
