Did you know??

❖ Did you know ... that the Nebraska Used Oil Collection Program now has 66 collection sites across the state that will take your uncontaminated used oil? In 2004, 5,682 individuals took their used oil into one of the city/county collection sites. A total of 144,809 gallons were collected. ❖ Did you know ... that the Nebraska Materials Exchange Program successfully diverted 16,270,586 pounds of good, reusable or recyclable materials from Nebraska landfills during 2004? Keep Nebraska Beautiful's Exchange Facilitators assist businesses, non-profit organizations, city, county and state government entities, and schools to either find materials they need, or to find good homes for the materials they don't need. ❖ Did you know ... that Keep Nebraska Beautiful, thanks to a grant from the Nebraska Environmental Trust, will be piloting the Nebraska Household Hazardous Waste Collection Program in the City of Kearney in 2005? Following the initial pilot program, we will be looking to expand that program across the state. The program will allow household hazardous waste to be collected on a permanent basis. If your community is interested in this program, please contact our office. Also, the "Under The Sink" permanent collection and processing facility in the City of Omaha will be opening this Spring. ❖ Did you know ... that Keep Nebraska Beautiful has joined forces with Congressman Tom Osborne's office, University of Nebraska Cooperative Extension, Nebraska Department of Roads, Nebraska Highway Patrol and the Nebraska Game and Parks Department to produce a methamphetamine litter education video, brochures to help in the identification of meth-lab litter and the safety procedures to follow, and a community educational piece to make persons more aware of meth lab litter and their dangers? A grant has been received from the Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality to assist with the effort. If you are interested in receiving these education materials, please contact our office. They should be available sometime this Spring.

CLEAN SWEEP U.S.A.

A "KEEP AMERICA BEAUTIFUL" COMMUNITY

Keep America Beautiful has launched an exciting new, web-based educational program for students and teachers. The program, Clean Sweep U.S.A., is interactive and includes lesson plans and evaluation tools for teachers. Educators can download lesson plans and evaluation material directly from the website.

The program features a fictional town, Clean Sweep U.S.A., and a colorful collection of citizens who lead visitors through the solid waste issues the town must tackle. Activities and information focus on recycling, composting, landfills, source reduction, and waste management.

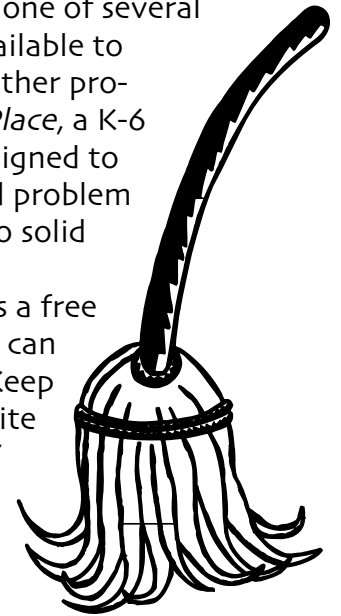
The interactive puzzles and games on the Clean Sweep U.S.A. website can be used in the classroom to help students become familiar with the real-life issues associated with municipal solid waste. The website is also designed to encourage students to continue learning about

these issues by doing independent research.

This program is only one of several educational resources available to teachers and students. Other programs include *Waste in Place*, a K-6 classroom curriculum designed to build critical thinking and problem solving skills in relation to solid waste management.

issue of *The Green Tree* includes information and educational activities focusing on a variety of solid waste

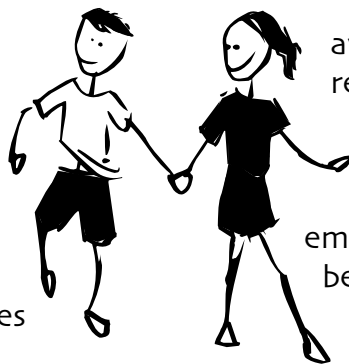
issues. *The Green Tree* primarily targets educators and students from 4th through 6th grades.

Topics covered in each newsletter include litter prevention, recycling, reuse, and source reduction. Various educational games like word searches, crossword puzzles, and true/false quizzes are also included in each issue.

To promote community involvement and activities outside the classroom, there are also a number of suggestions for projects like school/community litter cleanups, coordinating a waste-free lunch day in the school cafeteria, and organizing a local recycling drive. The games and activities correspond directly with the articles in each issue and are designed to promote classroom discussion.

2004 KEEP AMERICA BEAUTIFUL NATIONAL AWARDS



Keep America Beautiful hosted its annual awards luncheon on December 3, 2004 in Washington, D.C. The awards were presented to affiliates by KAB president, Ray Empson. During the awards ceremony President Empson remarked, "The example set and programs developed by

statewide affiliates in the Keep America Beautiful network cannot be overemphasized. A strong state program leads to a cleaner, safer and more beautiful state."

The following Nebraska Keep America Beautiful affiliates received recognition for their outstanding work in 2004:

Keep Schuyler Beautiful received the first-place Innovation Award in the Waste Reduction category. The program encourages waste reduction through recycling at all Schuyler Central High School sporting events. Plastic pop, water and sport drink bottles can be returned to concession stands in exchange for a free gummi worm. At one wrestling tournament, 750 gummi worms were handed out to participants. Sporting event attendees are also encouraged to pick up a trash bag at the concession stand and return it full of garbage for an additional reward.

Keep Beatrice Beautiful was one of twelve national award winners for their outstanding participation in the 2004 Great American Cleanup™. National Sponsor, Ruffies, presented Keep Beatrice Beautiful with the Best Promotional Campaign for the 2004 GAC. KBB sent home a Ruffies trash bag with all elementary students and asked them to walk a square block around their home and pick up trash. More than 200 students participated.

Keep Scottsbluff-Gering Beautiful was presented with a Distinguished Service Citation for their active participation and innovative programs in 2004. Their many projects included

promoting business recycling, collecting electronic waste, and organizing a paint exchange to keep usable paint out of the landfill. This affiliate also involved over 1,200 volunteers in the Great American Cleanup™ who collected over 791 tons of garbage in their community.

Keep Nebraska Beautiful was presented the Gold Level State Affiliate Recognition Award by KAB President Ray Empson. This award honors state affiliates that have achieved KAB's highest level of compliance and have successfully initiated the state affiliate guidelines to promote KAB's mission and programs.

Keep America Beautiful 2004 President's Circle Recognition Awards were presented to a number of Nebraska affiliates. These affiliates successfully conducted an annual Litter Index, calculated their Cost/Benefit ratio, attended KAB training, maintained an active board of directors, engaged volunteers to take greater responsibility for their community environment, and successfully promoted Keep America Beautiful programs.
